 Praise the Power that has made and pre - served us a na - tion.



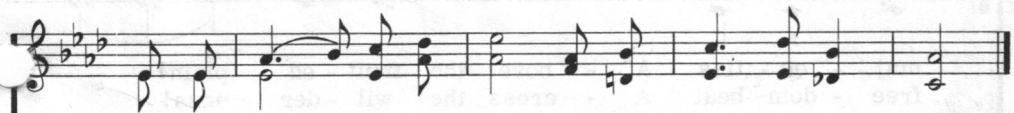
And the rock-et's red glare, the bombs burst-ing in air,
